### **Boating Safety and User Conflict Committee Meeting Minutes and Notes Of October 22, 2004**

This is a draft subject to approval on November 19th, 2004 and reformatting in the appropriate village format.

1. The meeting was called to order at 7:12 p.m. by Tom Porps

#### **Motions Made:**

1. Motion to approve all motions and the minutes of August 20th and September 17th meetings  
Made by Baratti, seconded by Hass, approved unanimously.
2. Motion to approve the minutes of June 11, 2004  
Made by Walsh, seconded by Hass, approved unanimously.
3. Motion to approve submission of the comprehensive Plan document as written subject to further refinement before the conclusion of this meeting.  
Made by a Hass, seconded by Walsh, motion carried.
4. Motion to: Recommend submission of the Comprehensive Plan to the steering committee based on detailed review and discussion of the Comprehensive Plan by the committee.  
Made by Hass, seconded Baratti, motion carried unanimously.

#### **Meeting Notes:**

- 1. User conflict –trash complaint:** A letter by Stephanie Darling was discussed and apparently the issue has been resolved with articles in question being removed from the complaint site.
- 2. User conflict - boat slips and docks:** Robert Livingston and Tom Props discussed from a meeting with the Wisconsin DNR representative regarding boat slips and docks. The DNR would like the village to handle any enforcement issues rather than get involved.
- 3. Administrative:** Mike Moran does not have e-mail and would like the village to make a copy of any e-mail notices and put them in his mailbox. We will try to note this on the cover e-mails for future minutes and agendas.
- 4. Agenda item- No Wake and other open items like response to Gerry Wrench's memo of August 5th:** Mike Moran commented that the No Wake issue would be revisited by the village board in November. He replied he needed to speak to David Cox regarding other issues.
- 5. Agenda item- Comprehensive plan.** Bill Hass presented a one-page written comprehensive plan for presentation to the steering committee and discussed related supporting documents that were integral parts of the comprehensive plan. Reading and discussion on the comprehensive plan continued from approximately 7:40 p.m. to the conclusion of the meeting at approximately 10:00 p.m. at which time unanimous support for the plan as outlined was approved. Key points discussed:
  - Due to time constraints and the other commitments, members Walsh and Vardon of the committee had to leave the meeting but supported their whole support of the comprehensive plan, before they departed. Their names are fixed to the document.
  - The plan provides guidance on future action but most importantly summarizes the views of the community as expressed in the annual meetings of Lake District in 2003 and 2004.
  - The committee has used the book *How's the Water*, in cases of dispute resolution and to support the need for community input when passing new regulations. Several sections of the book were read at the meeting to show how it provided guidance on key issues.
  - The plan references work done by all the committees as discussed at the

annual meeting, and the work of this committee in the form of the three ring binders in support or repeal of the No Wake ordinance.

- If the steering committee and the commissioners approve the plan, execution of the recommendations in the document can continue during the winter months.
- We strongly suggested that *color copies of the committee reports* presented at the annual meeting be included as Reference one to the plan.
- The lake committees have already done significant good and welfare for the lake community as evidenced by the votes and actions taken at the annual Lake District meeting and the significant remediation projects approved by the electors. It is clear the elector's direction and spirit to the commissioners is to focus on remediation not overregulation of lake users and taxpayers.

6. It was suggested that once a project is approved and funded—like Lance Park -- it should be executed by the accountable committee.
