She expressed that she felt a tribute to Mad Dan's would be appropriate, considering Jimmy's role in establishing a necessary public access on Lake Elizabeth. Pam also stated that she spoke to Tom Porps about putting the Buoy Boat on display at the Annual Meeting for attendees to see. She indicated that Tom believed the boat would add to the congestion, so he would not recommend having it on display. After some brief discussion, the committee agreed to address it as it came up. Corinne, then, asked the group about putting an informational flyer together regarding the recent Shoreland Overlay Ordinance Amendments as a handout for the meeting. This would help residents understand the ordinance they are suppose to follow. The group agreed. Mary then presented her idea of providing a volunteer pin to all Lake District Committee Members. She felt this would recognize each member for their contribution of blood, sweat, and tears increasing and maintaining the standard of living in Twin Lakes. She suggested the pins as a substitute for T-Shirts as they could be a little more subtle. Everyone thought this was a great idea and asked Mary to research some pricing, styles, and time frames for discussion at the next meeting.
