Question of the Day: "What do you think the Lake District will be like in 5-years?"

Members took a few minutes to consider the question. Some members felt that progress made in the next 5 years by the Lake District would spark greater community involvement and pride. In doing so, the committees would experience expansion and the Lake District would be recognized as a cooperative unit of the Village. Other comments indicated new potential projects and programs; for example, organized educational programs, a community outreach program where new residents receive a packet to welcome them to the community and provide them with information, and the possibility of a Lake Celebration.

Old Business:

Corinne suggested the committee pass on the topic of data sheets and informed committee members that she had submitted reimbursements to the Village. Corinne passed along information to the members that when receiving information from the Village for Committee use, they should state so at the time of acquiring the material. This way the Village staff will not request payment for materials and reimbursements will remain low leaving the budget open for other things.

On the topic of Educational Articles, the committee discussed the use of multiple sources such as the Kenosha News. Pam and Joe offered some potential contacts for the paper and stated that they would email them to Corinne for submittal of recent educational articles and press releases.

Pam reported on the Association Letter project stating that she received all the materials and will be distributing them to Lake Associations within the week. The committee briefly discussed how to handle any responses that come in.

New Business:

Corinne informed members that the Steering Council had overridden their decision not to move the Annual Meeting to Wilmot. This sparked commentary about putting a flyer together including a map, an address for the High School, potential shuttle buses, and a reason for moving the meeting. Pam and Mary volunteered to work on the flyer to be inserted in the mailer with the Meeting Agenda and Budget. John volunteered to look into shuttle bus pricing and Joe stated he would have slides ready for review at the next meeting. Members also talked about the potential of putting up signs to help attendees

find their way, not only to the High School, but to the Auditorium, as well. Corinne would check on the possibility of taking a tour of the facility to orchestrate an efficient set-up. Corinne then asked committee members how they felt about inviting special guests to the meeting. These special guests would include the WI-DNR, UW-Extension, WI-Wetland Association, WI-Woodland Owners Association, the McHenry County Land Conservation, the Police Department, and the Aquanauts. Members thought it would be great to have them set up a booth and provide information, then, ran with the idea thinking that next year it could be expanded to businesses.

Pam suggested the chair of each committee be contacted to begin compiling the slide content. She would ask for a brief review of 2006-2007 projects and potential 2007-2008 projects.

It was requested that a new item be added to the next agenda, involving discussion and possible action on a Lake Event to be held at Liberty Fest.
